<i>Remember to use:</i>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <i>Adjectives build up an atmosphere and allow the reader to picture the setting in their head</i></li></ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <i>Different sentence starters using ISPACE</i></li></ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <i>Figurative language – simile, metaphor, personification, alliteration, hyperbole</i></li></ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <i>Expanded noun phrases to convey detailed information</i></li></ul>
